Kegworth Air Disaster Commemoration

Many of you in the Village may remember, and indeed will have been part of, the rescue operation on the night of the Kegworth Air Disaster.

On 8th January, 1989 at 8:25 pm a Boeing 737-400, owned and operated by British Midland, crashed onto the westerly embankment of the M1 at Kegworth. Of the 126 passengers and crew on board, 47 were killed, 5 had minor injuries and 74 were seriously injured. The aircraft had been engaged on a double shuttle between London Heathrow and Belfast.

Kegworth Parish Council together with East Midlands Airport are organising a special Community Event to commemorate the 30th Anniversary of the Kegworth Air Disaster.

There will be a Memorial Service held at St Andrew's Church on Tuesday 8th January 2019 at 11am. This will be followed by the laying of wreaths at the Memorial in the Cemetery, Whatton Road. Light refreshments will be served in the Village Hall, Nottingham Road from 12 noon.

HS2 Impact on Kegworth Village – Consultation

The High Speed 2 Rail Link is controversial with arguments for and against and you have probably heard rumblings about whether HS2 will even be built, however the Government is currently insisting that it will go ahead. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2023 with the line opening in 2033.

Our village is due to be significantly impacted by HS2, some examples are loss of sports facilities at the top of Ashby Road, a large permanent electrical relay station to be positioned near J24 of the M1 and two fairly substantial construction compounds to be erected in a similar location. The huge impact that the construction phase will have on the local area must not be underestimated as this will be considerable and long lasting.

The Parish Council is working to ensure that the impact of HS2 on Kegworth village is recognised, mitigated against and, ultimately, compensation is considered. To address this, the Parish Council is receiving support from NWLDC and SLC Rail to prepare a response to the consultation on the draft Environmental Statement and Equality Impact Assessment reports for HS2 Phase 2b. These two separate consultations were launched on 11th October and will end at 23:45 on 21st December 2018.

As a resident of Kegworth, if you want your voice to be heard on HS2, the Parish Council urges you to reply to the consultations either by:

- Completing the response forms: copies available at the Parish Office, 1 London Road or Kegworth Community Library, High Street. These forms should then be emailed to environment2b@ipsos-mori.com or sent via freepost to FREEPOST HS2 PHASE 2B ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTATION.

If you attended the HS2 Information Event at Yew Lodge on 15th November and expressed your view verbally to HS2 employees, please note that this DOES NOT constitute a response to the consultations and you still need to respond online or by completing and submitting the response forms.

Village Redevelopment an update

The bypass is now open! The contractor completed on 31st October with the relevant sign offs required thereafter, involving the Highways Authority and a Road Safety Audit, meaning opening of the new A6 bypass on 14th November.

A village consultation was carried out for six weeks in April and May 2018 which detailed a concept for the village centre and suggested proposed additional parking on Derby Road. We also asked if residents would be willing to pay towards the redevelopment. The results told us there was not an overall majority in favour of the concept itself. however residents did want to see restricted parking on Market Place and additional restricted parking on Derby Road. Residents feedback in relation to funding such a scheme from their Council Tax, met with a majority 'no'.

The Parish Council currently holds a community fund of around £227,000 and in view of the responses, is mindful that this sum needs to be spent very wisely to achieve not only parking, but also traffic calming along the detrunked A6. Without traffic calming in place, the Parish Council is concerned that the speed of traffic on this route will increase. To be able to introduce all of this for £227,000, it is likely that any alterations will consist of 'lines and signs' as it will be unaffordable to move

kerb stones or introduce expensive materials to a scheme.

We continue to work with the Urban Designer at NWLDC, a Highway Planning and Design Consultant and knowledgeable volunteers. It is hoped that an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order can be introduced on Market Place and Derby Road. The experiment would last for 18 months and can be adjusted during that time, if required. After 18 months of experimenting, the scheme would then become permanent.

We are also looking at linking Kegworth village to local existing cycleways. For example, a new cycleway has been created along the A453, there are cycling opportunities the other side of J24 roundabout and also the other side of the new roundabout at London Road. Currently none of these routes are linked to the village. We believe this would be a good opportunity as not only will it provide sustainable travel options for residents to reach local businesses, nearby villages and towns but will also promote health and wellbeing. Once a Cycling Strategy has been produced for the village, we believe additional funds become available to carry out some of the works required to create these links.

Kegworth Imps JFC have been in existence since 1975 and provides football for boys and girls.

We have won many trophies over the years and have had the great fortune in providing some players to professional and semi-professional clubs.

We are a Charter Standard Club which means all our team coaches are qualified up to FA standard and the club is run to FA guidelines. We are currently running five teams from U/9's to U/13's and run a soccer school which takes place on a Saturday morning for players ages 5 years to 8 years, this takes place on King George V playing field. All our teams play on Sundays. Most of our teams are up to capacity but we are still recruiting for our U/13's. However, if your child would like to come and join in the training sessions we will be more than happy to have them.

We hold an annual presentation evening at the end of the season where every player receives a trophy and thank you for playing for our club.

We charge an annual fee of £120 which covers games, kit and training.

Our major problem now is recruiting volunteers for our teams. At U/7 and U/8 we have enough players, but we don't have managers or coaches to run these two age groups. This will eventually mean most of the boys will drift away to other teams outside the village and therefore the club will run out of teams.

and training during your first season.
