Maintaining Our Grass Verges

Leicestershire County Council is responsible for cutting most of the grass verges at the side of the Highway in Kegworth. The County Council have a duty to ensure visibility is maintained for road users, so junctions and bends in the road should be cut back for safetv purposes. Motorways and trunk roads are cut by National Highways.

You Said, We Did...

The Parish Council frequently receives feedback from residents about matters important to Kegworth. Councillors work hard to address the issues which raised. Often this involves are engagement with the County and District Councils, the Police, and other Recently, councillors have agencies. been seeking solutions to the following:

Highways Matters

For some time, the Council has been seeking a meeting with officers and elected members to find a solution to some of the concerns which have been raised. ln councillors July. Andrew Priestley, Ray Sutton and Carol Sewell, and the clerk, Donna Griggs, met with the County Council Cabinet Member Highways, Transportation and Flooding, our local councillor (Trevor Pendleton), the Traffic and Safety Team Manager for the County Council. and the Head Planning for the District Council.

The Parish Council had put together a list of highway safety matters which were discussed at length and responded to, including:

- £20,000 of S106 funding which was given by developers towards a pedestrian crossing on Sideley - this is still available, but will not be enough to provide a full crossing.
- Quiet Lane on Long Lane Safety matters relating to cyclists and pedestrians were discussed.
- Maintenance of hedges on the hotel side of Derby Road and at the junction of High Street/Derby Road - these are the responsibility of the property owners and not the Local Authority. LCC provided information on how they would respond to any complaints and follow up with enforcement action.

- Safety measures for pedestrians on various roads within Kegworth - it was suggested that the Parish Council conducts a survey to seek residents views on any suggested changes before pursuing any matters further.
- Confirmation of which areas of Pritchard Drive have been adopted - this information was provided and a plan is available in the Parish Office for anyone interested in seeing it.

Bin Issues

In June, Councillors Priestley, Williams, Sutton, and Sewell met with officers from the District Council to address some of the concerns residents had raised at the Meet Your Village event and via other communications



regarding the provision of bins in the village.

We are pleased to report the following agreements:

- The District Council will make an additional weekly collection from the bins located near the entrances to Whatton Road Park and the King George V field, the Four Turns junction, and the Station Road bridge (Mellors farm).
- The District Council will reinstate the bin on Station Road in the area near the bus shelter opposite the Anchor.
- The District Council will look into relocating a bin to the top of Ashby Road near the bypass.
- The District Council will review the feasibility of adding a new bin at Springfield near the footpath/stile to the fields.

Completion of the Public Realm Project

Thank you to residents and businesses for your patience and tolerance during the disruption caused by the recent public realm works to the Market Place and London Road and the subsequent re-surfacing works on Derby Road.

The Public Realm project was part of a significant investment in the village, funded by the Leicester and Leicestershire Enterprise Partnership, the District Council, and Kegworth Parish Council. North West Leicestershire District Council has managed the project, with Leicestershire County Council handling the delivery.

The project has included the design and installation of the village gateways, the improved footway connection on London Road, a re-design of the Market Place, and the relocation of the bus shelter near the church, so that people don't have to wait for the bus on the wrong side of the road.

With the exception of minor snagging, the works are complete now that the resurfacing of Market Place and the markings for the parking spaces have been done. It is hoped the new layout of spaces will provide a safer and more coherent arrangement for all users of the Market Place space.

Public feedback shaped the plans to create an attractive public space in the village centre, which is part of the conservation area, that can easily be used for events while still providing the necessary parking at other times.



Allotments

As you might know, the Parish Council owns the allotment sites on Station Road, Sideley, and School Alley and these prove popular with residents.

We have had some movement with plot holders over the last year and our waiting list is now lower than it was.

Annual rents for the allotments vary in price depending on the size of the allotment; they are not expensive to rent.
